



About the Queen St Mall

Queen Street is Brisbane's most historic and most notable street. The mall that runs between George and Edward Streets, which opened in 1982, is the most successful pedestrian mall in the southern hemisphere.

The hub of Brisbane's retail precinct, the mall displays excellent examples of old and new architecture, with the light, intricate structures in the mall providing interesting contrast to the buildings that line each side. The façades of some of the oldest buildings in Brisbane are amongst them.

About the Brisbane River

The river was traditionally a rich hunting ground for the Jagera and Turrbal tribes of the area. It was first surveyed by John Oxley in 1823 who recommended it as a site for a convict settlement.

The Brisbane River catchment has a sub-tropical climate with 1.5m of rainfall a year mostly as intense summer storms. It is the largest catchment in South East Queensland at 13,500km² and supports the largest population of any catchment in Queensland, with over one million inhabitants.

Dominating the banks of the Brisbane River are Gray Mangrove trees acting as nurseries for the river fish. The river and its wonderful surroundings are best explored on a CityCat ferry cruise.
